SEDC ENERGY AND SARAWAK FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT CONTINUE RAMADAN TRADITION WITH BUBUR PEDAS DISTRIBUTION

KUCHING: Sarawak Economic Development Corporation (SEDC) new energy arm SEDC Energy (SEDCE) and the Sarawak Fire and Rescue Department (Bomba), continues its annual Ramadan outreach by distributing 'Bubur Pedas' to surrounding communities at the PETROS Multifuel Station (MFS) Batu Kawa today.

The communities involved are RPR Batu Kawa Phase 2, Kampung Sinar Budi and Taman Desa Bumiko and Taman Desa Wira, who received their Bubur Pedas from the State BOMBA Director Jamri Masran and SEDCE Head of Sales and Operations Kathleen Kiew representing Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Robert Hardin.

Now in its third consecutive year, the initiative reflects the shared commitment of both organisations to strengthen community ties and celebrate Sarawak's rich Ramadan traditions through meaningful engagement.

Earlier, the programme saw SEDCE and Bomba personnel working side-by-side in preparing the traditional Sarawakian Ramadan delicacy at the Bomba Sarawak Headquarters.

SEDCE Chief Executive Officer Robert Hardin said the initiative reflects the role of PETROS MFS as a community-centric station, serving not only as an energy retail hub but also as a platform for meaningful engagement with the surrounding communities.

"As Sarawak's very own brand, PETROS MFS is poised to be more than just a refuelling station. It is a community centre that brings everyone together under one roof such as what we are doing today," said Robert.

The collaboration between SEDCE and Bomba continues to highlight the importance of community partnerships in delivering positive social impact, particularly during the holy month of Ramadan.

Meanwhile, SEDCE has commissioned 12 PETROS Multifuel Stations (MFS) are operational across Sarawak, namely MFS Darul Hana (Jalan Tun Salahuddin), MFS Daro (Jalan Matu-Daro), MFS Kanowit (Jalan Kubu), MFS Kuala Matu (Jalan Daro-Kuala Matu), MFS Brooke Drive (Sibu), MFS Selangau (Pan Borneo-Selangau), MFS Tatau (Pan Borneo-Tatau), MFS Kapit (Jalan Bletch), MFS Sungai Asap (Jalan Bintulu-Bakun), MFS Jepak (Kampung Jepak), and MFS Batu Kawa (Jalan Batu Kawa)

By Q2 this year, the construction of the third flagship MFS at Jalan Sultan Iskandar in Bintulu is expected to complete. The flagship stations are designed not only to provide conventional fuel and EV charging facilities, but also hydrogen dispensing. Other non-flagship station at strategic locations in Sarawak is designed to be equipped with EV charging station on top of the conventional fuel.

Three other flagship PETROS MFS located in Sri Aman, Miri and Sibul have been identified and will be rolled out in phases. These flagship stations serves as the backbone of Sarawak's hydrogen refuelling network across major urban centres, while standard PETROS MFS continue to provide conventional fuels alongside electric vehicle (EV) charging facilities.

SEDCE is working on another 40 additional identified sites currently under various stages of planning and development. In addition to the MFS, SEDCE have also commissioned 17 EV charging facilities in 10 locations across the state. Another additional 25 locations with 45 chargers have also been identified and currently in several stages of approvals.
